The Areas

The Area Councils have organised an excellent events programme during 2014/15 with 57 events being run throughout the UK and Ireland including leading industry speakers, driving simulators, depot visits, company visits and social events. IRO marketing continues to promote the "behind the scenes access" that the Area's events provide as one of the best reasons to join the IRO. Area events cards and Area brochures have been produced to raise both the profile of our Area events programme and our Area Council roles within the IRO.

There were three changes of Area Council Chair during 2014/15. In the South West and Wales Area, Lawrie Hall stepped down with Nick Edwards taking up the role as Chair. In the Midlands Area, Mike Christelow stepped down with Rachel Heath taking up the role as Chair. In the North West and Wales Area, Carl Phillips stepped down with Chris Mackenzie taking up the role as Chair.

Thank you to Lawrie, Mike and Carl for all their time and attentions throughout their tenure as Area Council Chair and we welcome Nick, Rachel and Chris who have already taken up where their predecessors left off.

The Chair of the Scottish Area stepped down from the role. This position is currently vacant and as a result the Scottish Area does not have a current events programme in place. REF events are being publicised for our members in the Scottish Area. A new Area Council is currently being recruited.

The South East Area has also continued with its excellent high profile involvement with the Golden Whistles Awards in conjunction with the Fourth Friday Club.

The North East, North West and Wales, Midlands and South West and Wales areas have created varied event programmes to appeal to the membership in their area.



We have continued to promote the benefits of IRO membership with our Corporate Members and we have seen a continued growth in individual membership growth as employees of our Corporate Members take up this opportunity to become a member of the IRO.

Membership



The membership growth seen during 2013/14 has continued in 2014/15, resulting in a 28% year on year growth from Oct-14 to Sep-15.

4000th member: During December 2014 the IRO membership passed the 4000 mark.

The main growth area has been at Affiliate level where we have welcomed employees from our Corporate Members followed by a 12% increase in Fellows.

Thank you to the Membership Panel for their continued support and commitment to professional excellence.

The membership turnover for 2014/15 is 1.0%. 40 leavers were recorded during this period with an overall increase in total membership of 834.

Learning Programmes

Progress to merge users between the main IRO website and IRO learn has been steady, MKM have projected this into the first quarter of next year and we hope to have a fully integrated password experience in place by then. This will improve member access to learning products and simplify the administration process, aiding further development of resources available to members.

We have produced a series of ERTMS learning videos in conjunction with the RSSB and further with groups of industry specialists whom have direct involvement with the roll out. Although continuing as work in progress, we have currently over 20 videos made available to view through IRO Learn, cataloguing different aspects of how ERTMS will change procedures and working methods for railway operators.

Video coverage and archive has continued throughout the year, recording IRO events and collaborating with other organisations to share media resources. The REF Freight, IRSE Capability and Competency seminars were notable successes, along with the IRO morning seminar at the annual lunch being well received. All these event productions are accessible to IRO members through IRO Learn.

Work has been completed on the redesign of the IRO Learn website to speed up user access and usability, also key elements of the existing railwayoperators.co.uk site have been modified to increase awareness of both academic and online courses. The IRO video content on the main IRO website has been refreshed to reflect staffing changes and new supporting course brochures.

The recent integration of Twitter on both website homepages has notably assisted in increasing social media traffic.

Development work has been done to provide an anonymous method of producing visual learning materials and videos for use in our Ops180 short courses. This development involves the production of 'cartoonified' video to support the scenario/role play sections of the taught courses, hopefully allowing them

to be delivered in many cases by a single member of staff or even by the company themselves without clash or conflict of any company branding appearing in the video content.

Work has continued with NR to bring together a focussed series of events and sponsored campaign to increase service quality and improve performance. The details of the programme have seen preliminary planning and discussion with speakers has begun, hopefully to begin in the middle of next year.

Work has been completed on a development website where Members and Fellows can support questions from any other IRO member on a dedicated Railway Operations discussion platform. This is seen as a great aid to learning for all members and will take the form of a specialist forum, only accessible to IRO membership. We are awaiting password integration across all sites to be provided by MKM before we advance further with this project.

The Operators Handbook is now being prepared for eventual on-line publication where it will reach a wider audience in the industry forming part of the benefits package available to all IRO members. Taking the book online will remove print production costs and enable updates and additions to be carried out with relative ease. The appointment of section heads who will have control over content in their specialist fields is under discussion. This will hopefully help to fill the industry gaps of the previous editions.







Finance

The accounts are displayed for a 12-month period ending 30th September 2015.

In 2015 the IRO made a profit of £8,391. The forecast profit for this period was £4,000 which included a development budget of £33,048 which was spent in full.

In summary, the IRO has made a bigger profit than forecast. Despite a drop in overall sales, a cautious attitude to spending has led to a bigger drop in overheads.

People Updates

During this year, Tricia Meade left us and a change in the marketing team led to the appointment of Simon Rawlings who has kick started the IRO's social media presence.

Conclusion

Despite a disappointing year on academic sales, the sales activity for 2015 was healthy and we have recovered and exceeded this ground for the current academic year.

This year the IRO has continued to increase the value of its offering to members and corporate members alike. Its rate of growth exceeds any comparators in membership organisations we benchmark. Many core businesses processes are now well established.

I would like to thank everyone in the IRO network for making the organisation and the brand what it is today.

As work continues at Board level on strategy development and the application for Chartered status, I would encourage any member to look out for opportunities to get involved with the work of taking the organisation forward.




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
